**Otsego County Road Commission manager
to lead statewide road association as vice president**

LANSING, MI – Kirk Harrier, managing director of the Otsego County Road Commission, has been elected by the County Road Association (CRA) of Michigan Board of Directors to serve as its 2026-2027 vice president.



Harrier has served as managing director of the Otsego County Road Commission since 2020. He brings more than three decades of public sector experience, having worked at multiple levels of government throughout his career.

He began his career as an equipment operator with the Calhoun County Road Commission (now Calhoun County Road Department) before going on to serve in several roles, including department analyst with the Michigan Department of State, director of development services

for the City of Allegan and city manager for the City of Saugatuck.

Harrier has been actively involved with CRA, serving on the Association’s Canvassing Committee and as former chair of the Straits Area District.

“I am honored to have the opportunity to serve CRA and its members in this leadership role,” Harrier said. “County road agencies play a critical role in Michigan’s infrastructure, and I look forward to working with my colleagues to continue advancing our shared priorities.”

The 83 members of the County Road Association of Michigan represent the unified voice for a safe and efficient county transportation infrastructure system in Michigan, including appropriate stewardship of the public’s right-of-way in rural and urban Michigan. Collectively, Michigan’s county road agencies manage 75% of all roads in the state, including 90,500 miles of roads and 5,900 bridges. County road agencies also maintain the state’s highway system in 63 counties. Michigan has the nation’s fourth-largest local road system.
