Voters show support for road millages on May 6 Consolidated Election ballot

Lansing, MI – Voters in local elections across Michigan expressed support for road millages during the May Consolidated Election by passing three millage renewals on the ballot, according to data provided by Lansing-based *Gongwer News Service*.

“As we await the Legislature’s action on a pending statewide road-funding solution, local road funding remains a crucial piece of the puzzle,” said Denise Donohue, CEO of the County Road Association (CRA) of Michigan. “We’re grateful to neighbors in every county who support road measures at the ballot box.”

Total road millage renewals on the ballot were four and total road millage increases (including Headlee Amendment adjustments) two. Across the state, 75% of millage renewals passed, while neither of the new or increased millages passed.

All election results, including millages, are unofficial until certified by the State Bureau of Elections.

The 83 members of the County Road Association of Michigan represent the unified voice for a safe and efficient county transportation infrastructure system in Michigan, including appropriate stewardship of the public’s right-of-way in rural and urban Michigan. Collectively, Michigan’s county road agencies manage 75% of all roads in the state, including 90,500 miles of roads and 5,900 bridges. County road agencies also maintain the state’s highway system in 63 counties. Michigan has the nation’s fourth-largest local road system.
