County Road Association's 2023 Highway Conference & Road Show coming to the Lansing Center March 21-23

LANSING, MI – New ways to utilize available transportation funding will be the center of attention at the County Road Association (CRA) of Michigan's 2023 Highway Conference & Road Show March 21-23, at the Lansing Center.

More than 900 county transportation infrastructure stakeholders will gather at this three-day event to grow their knowledge and aptitude for maintaining the nation's fourth largest local road network.

"Change is everywhere in transportation infrastructure," said CRA CEO Denise Donohue. "With that comes new opportunities for county road agencies to show how our culture of innovation leads to gains on the local road system and increased quality of life for residents across Michigan."

Topics covered at the Highway Conference include new options for using federal aid for roads; new competitive grants in the federal Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act (IIJA); new technologies for streamlining county road agency operations; and more.

A key session at the Conference will cover recovering lost revenue from electric vehicles and next generation road funding, a new Legislative Priority for the Association and the subject of a recent report authored by Anderson Economic Group for CRA (available at micountyroads.org/CRAEVStudy).

On Tuesday, March 21 from 2:30-6:30 p.m., and Wednesday, March 22 from 9 a.m. – noon, the CRA Road Show will feature over 100 vendors representing everything from heavy equipment to the latest technology and automation.
